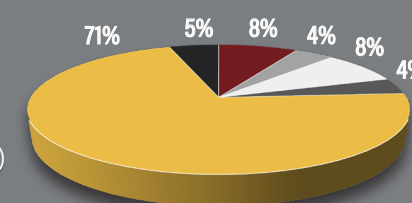

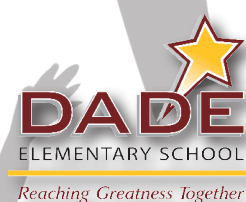

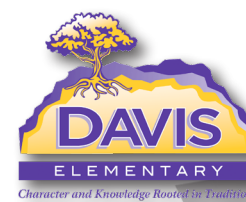

CAREER, TECHNICAL AND AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION



Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA): Twenty-seven students from the Business Pathway earned Microsoft Certification, an industry credential recognized by the GADOE and administered through the on-line Certiport Testing Center. Future Business Leaders of America Students earned 1st Place in the Graphic Design event at the Region Legion Conference and advanced to the State Leadership Conference where they made it to the final round of competitions earning 10th place.

Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA): FCCLA's mission is to promote personal growth and leadership development through Family and Consumer Sciences education. Our local chapter focuses on service projects across the lifespan. An FCCLA favorite in 2021 was Operation Elderly! More than 800 items were donated by DCHS students and compiled into gift bags and delivered to well-deserving senior citizens in our county. Throughout the year, students help with hospitality luncheons and special events for DCHS students and staff. FCCLA officers and members participate in team building and leadership activities at local, region, and state meetings. Jayle Belue experienced the parliamentary process when she represented our chapter as a voting delegate in our FCCLA State Executive Session. In FCCLA, members develop leadership qualities that can be used in their everyday roles.

Healthcare Occupation Students of America (HOSA): Hosted their annual Blood Drive with Blood Assurance: 54 donors registered (20 were first time donors), 9 donors were deferred, and 64 units were collected. HOSA students collaborated with students from the Mechatronics class to make prototypes and presented them to the team from NASA.

SkillsUSA: David Howard received a \$2000 scholarship for his program from the Home Builders Association of Georgia. Jake Marshall donated a stand-alone HVAC unit for the program. Mr. Howard's carpentry students built and installed 18 story walk podiums at Davis Elementary.

Work-Based Learning & Youth Apprenticeship: Fifty-three students completed a total of 29,846 Work-Based Learning hours earning over \$270,000 in wages. Thirteen students completed a total of 5,375 Youth Apprenticeship hours earning over \$12,000 in wages.

Other: The 1st Annual DCHS Career Fair was a major success with over forty businesses present for the event. Students were provided a face-to-face opportunity to learn about the various employment opportunities right in their neighborhood. BE PRO BE PROUD is an initiative that was started by the Cherokee Office of Economic Development and is leading the movement to bring a new generation of pride, progress, and professionals to Georgia's Skilled workforce. CTAE students had the opportunity to participate in the various simulations like welding and robotics on the BE PRO BE PROUD bus.

Dade County Schools Career & Technology Innovation

Dade County Schools Career and Technology Innovation (CTI) mission is to provide Project-Based Learning experiences that empower and inspire students to find innovative solutions to global challenges. Thanks to our partnership with NASA HUNCH, 3rd through 12th grade students actively carry out this mission utilizing specialized software and equipment to participate in Flight 3d-print, CAD design, Health Care/Biomedical Engineering, video and media, graphic arts patch design, elementary student level Tinker CAD/3D print, and the new expansion of Commercial Sewing and Culinary Space Food to begin Fall of 2022. Because of the dedication and innovative minds of our students, Dade County Schools was named the first NASA HUNCH Center of Excellence.

BIOMEDICAL: CTAE Healthcare and Mechatronics students collaborated with the NASA HUNCH program to create the first NASA HUNCH Health Science and Biomedical Engineering partnership. Students utilized both innovative thinking and advanced 3D equipment to design a sensory smell recall and mental health stimulation prototype for humans in space exploration. The students presented their prototypes to founder and co-founder of the NASA HUNCH program Stacy Hale and Bob Zeek. As a result, DCHS students are now participating in the first mental health project for astronauts on the International Space Station (ISS).

ASTRO RESTORATION: The Astro 1 Space Telescope flew in 1988. It took the first UV, Spectrum, Gamma Ray, and X-Ray images of all planets and nebulas and is the predecessor to the Hubble Telescope. The Astro Restoration Project (ARP), began as a labor of love, with personnel who worked the Astro missions rescuing the Astro Cruciform and other flight hardware from government property auctions and collectors following the end of the Spacelab Program. That hardware remained in storage for over 20 years. The hardware that could not be salvaged or recovered was duplicated by students through the NASA HUNCH program. Students reversed-engineered the parts needed by recreating CAD images from the original blueprints provided by NASA. The students then created duplicated parts used in the final assembly with industrial 3D-printers at DMS and DCHS. The ARP will be displayed at the Huntsville Space and Rocket Center and the Smithsonian Museum.

SOFTGOODS: HUNCH Sewn Flight Articles, also known as Softgoods, is a program using fabric and other soft materials to create goods requested by different NASA centers as well as the International Space Station Astronaut Crew. This can range from redesigning the crew pantry to creating kits for the Crew's personal items. Softgoods provides a unique design opportunity using various materials to keep the crew not only safe but clean and comfortable aboard their stay. DMS is offering the first inclusion class with NASA HUNCH through the GNETS program. Students are taught quality assurance best practices so they learn to expect quality from all items they create. They are also shown proper safety documentation making them more accountable for their output ensuring tractability from start to finish.

CULINARY: The Astronaut Culinary Challenge develops food items for the Astronauts aboard the International Space Station from a general theme idea. Each year a new theme is given to schools. The students create new dishes taking into account food processing procedure and nutritional requirements so that their items will meet the standards of the NASA Johnson Space Center Food Lab. DCHS is excited to bring this opportunity to its students and show how research into space isn't limited to only STEM fields as well as educating students in researching and presenting their work in a professional environment.

GREENPOWER USA: DMS students continue to expand their capacity for innovation and hands-on learning through GreenPower USA. This program features a science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) program that engages students academically and builds critical employability skills through hands-on, project-based learning experiences. Through sustainable, multi-disciplinary, and cross-curricular applied-learning, students are designing and building electric cars from scratch and then invited to compete in design-build-race competitions. The DC Racers had their first competition at the Talladega Superspeedway and took home first place in both races in the stock category.
