One of Georgia's largest most picturesque parks, Cloudland Canyon State Park, on the edge of Lookout Mountain, boasts spectacular sunsets, gorgeous panoramic vistas, and a wealth of flora and fauna. Take in the grandeur of plunging waterfalls and the elegance of trickling woodland creeks both working together to carve 1,000-foot-deep canyons and caves along the way. There are popular hiking, mountain biking and equestrian trails to try. The park also offers disc golf, a fishing pond, interpretive center programs and overlooks. Campers can set up in fully equipped cozy cottages or yurts along with 70+ tent, trailer, and RV campsites. Backpackers can secure more private overnight options in the wild. Join Hayrides every Saturday in October, and



Star Parties the first Saturday of the month in the Summer. Meander through the prismatic fall colors and lush spring foliage at the park.
